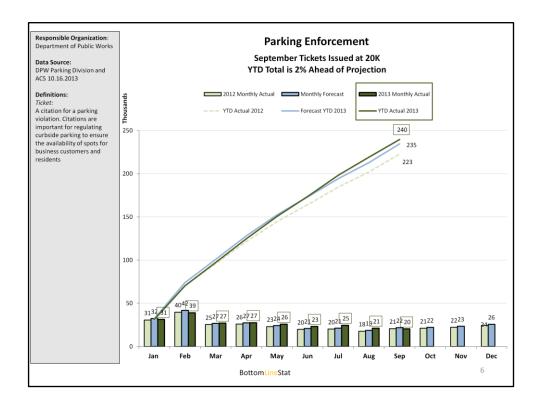
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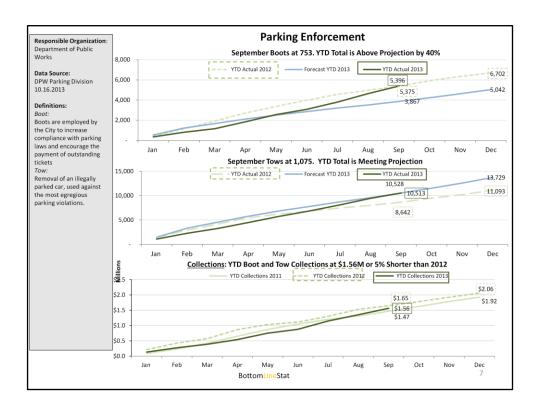


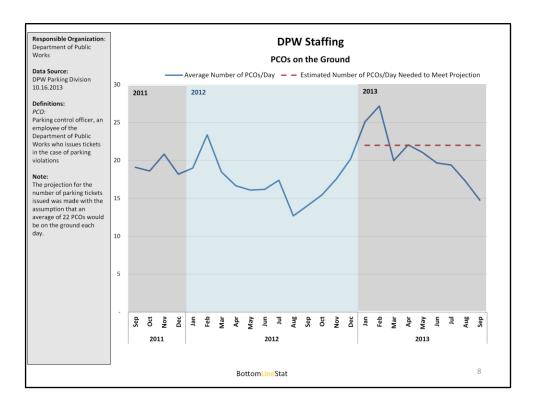


Despite having a higher rate of towing and ticket issuance and a comparable rate of booting from 2012, total collections are down. This is the result of several large delinquency payments in 2012, as well as overall higher yields from ticketing and booting.

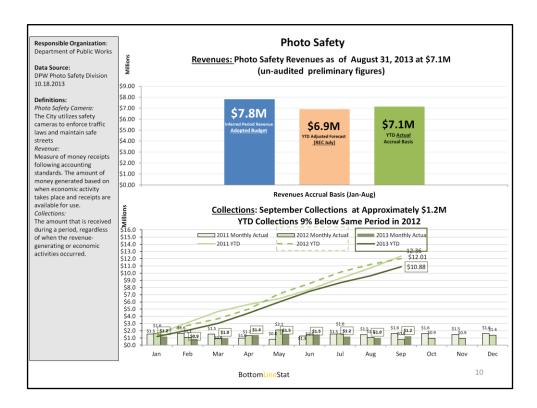

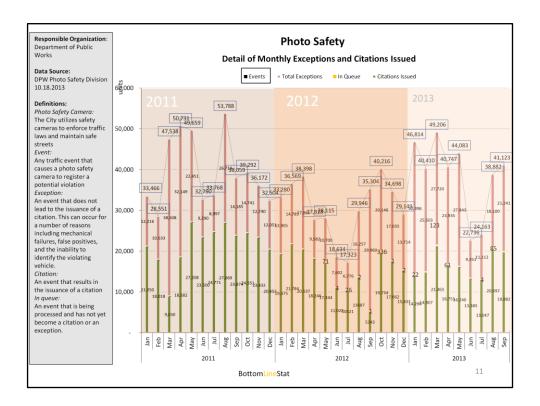




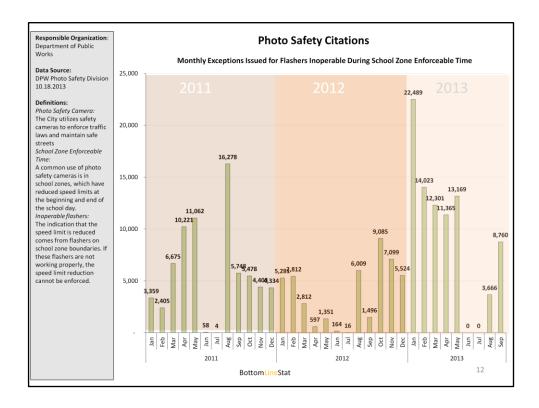




Revenue from red light cameras is trending upward, though the Department of Public Works does not expect to meet the original revenue projection.



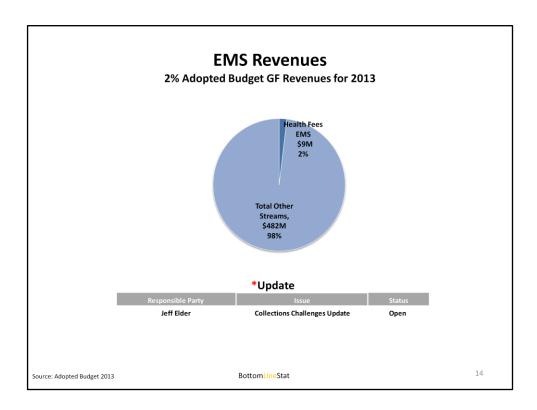
There are many causes of exceptions than the 8,760 inoperable school zone flashers shown on the next page. The most common causes are identification issues and non-violations that trigger the safety camera.

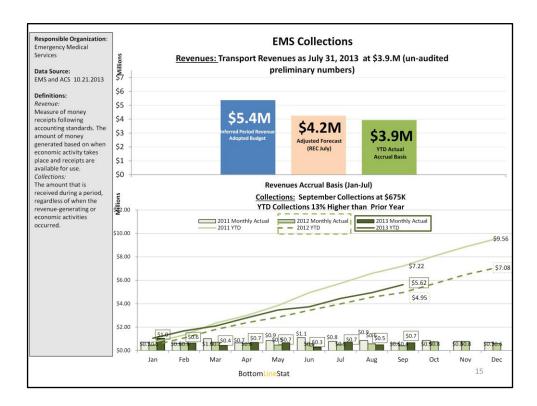


The increase in September from August is not due to more inoperable flashers, but having a full month of schools in session.

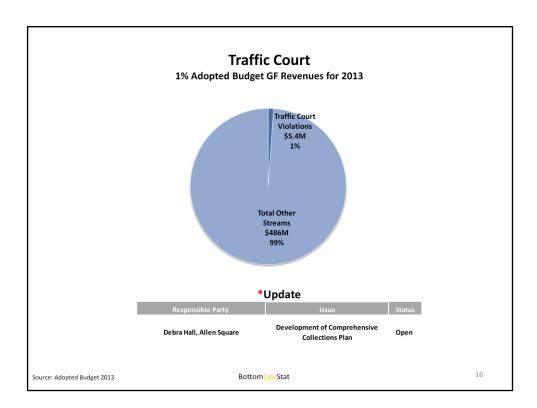

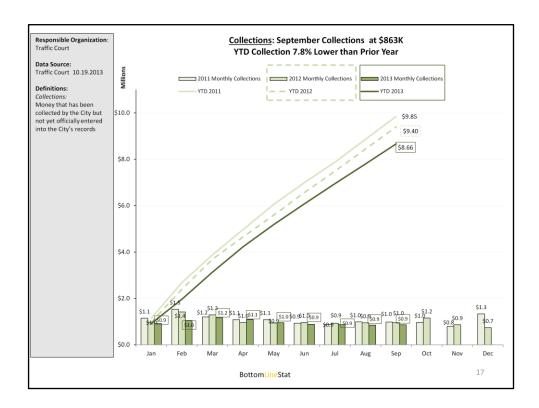
A number of the flashers that had the highest number of exceptions in September will be replaced with AC-powered LED flashers, which should substantially decrease the number of school zone exceptions.



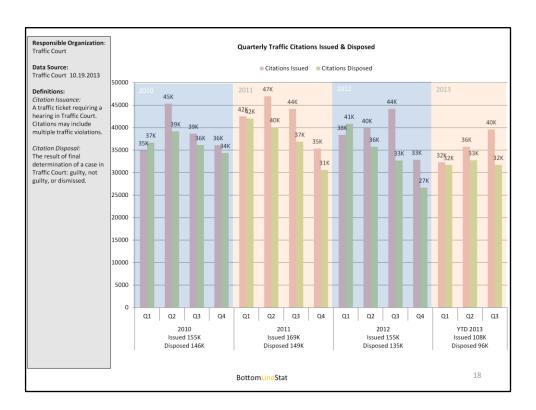


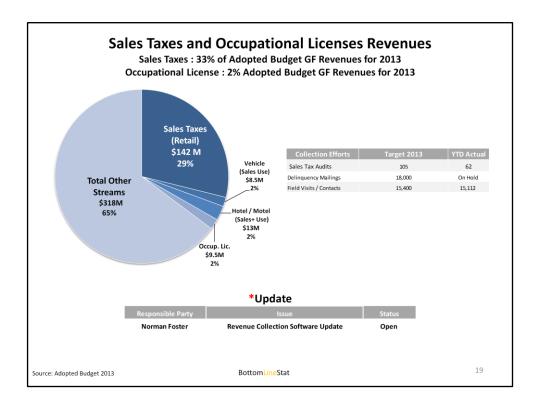

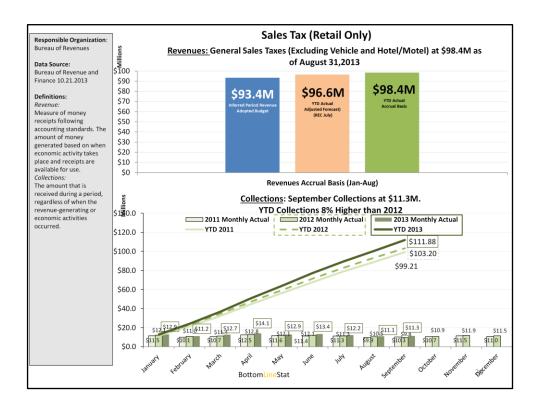




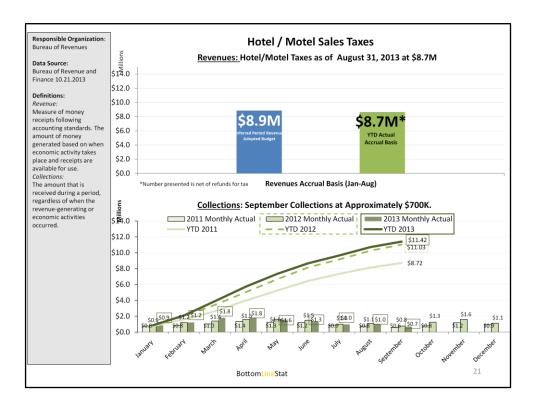
The Traffic Court has been working with the department of Information Technology and Innovation on a request for proposals on a new case management system that should increase collections and case disposal times.



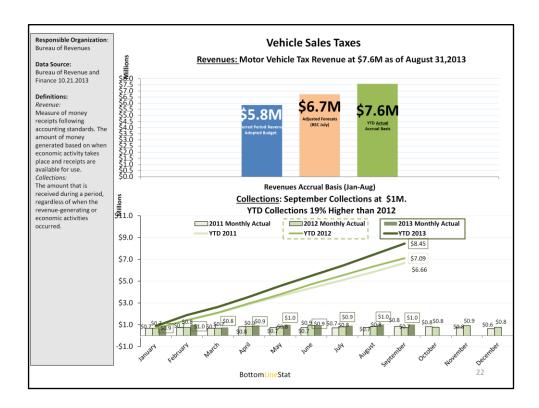




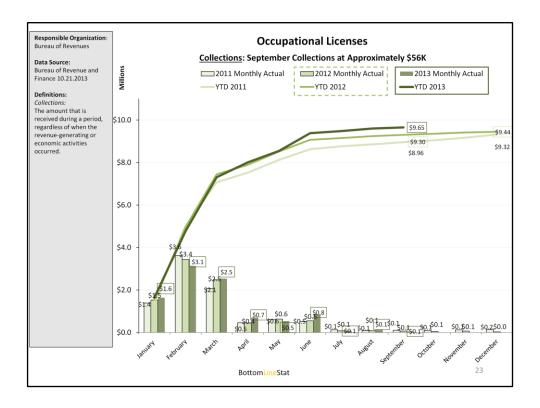
There will be a small sales tax refund to the NFL, but this should not substantially affect the final revenue.



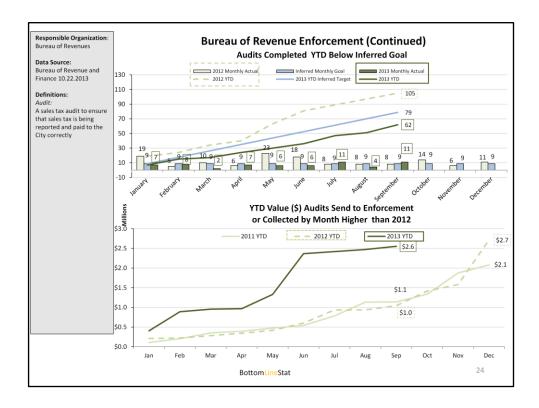
The refund is due to a hotel that had been paying taxes to the City that should have gone to the State.



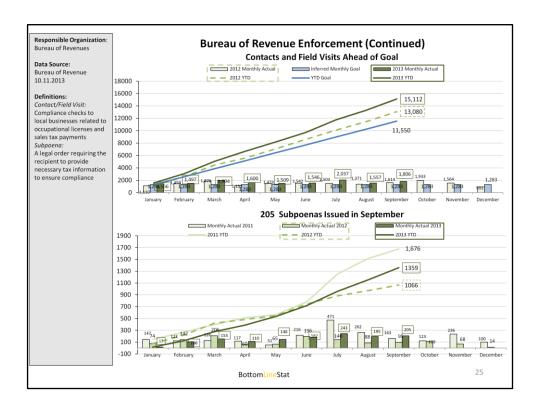

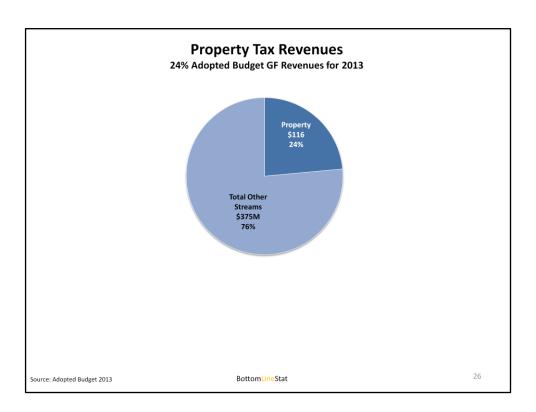


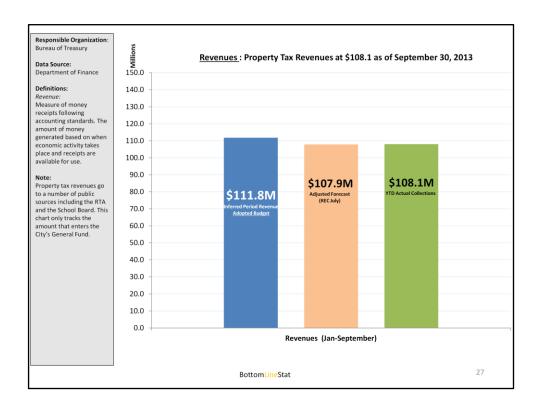
The increase in occupational license tax collections is an indicator of the increasing number of businesses in New Orleans.



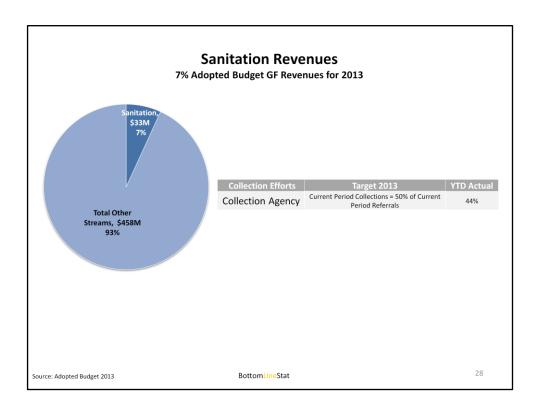
The decrease in audits completed during the year is partially a function of high turnover of auditors, many of whom have gone on to work in other City departments.

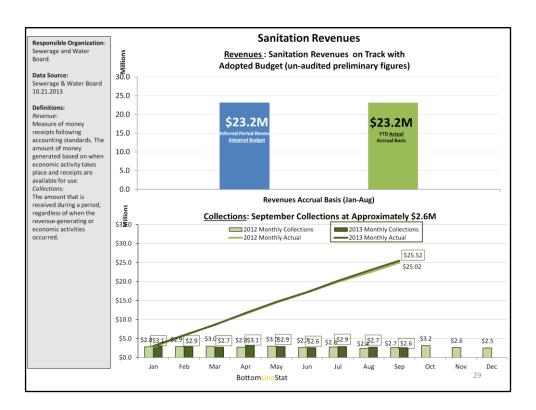


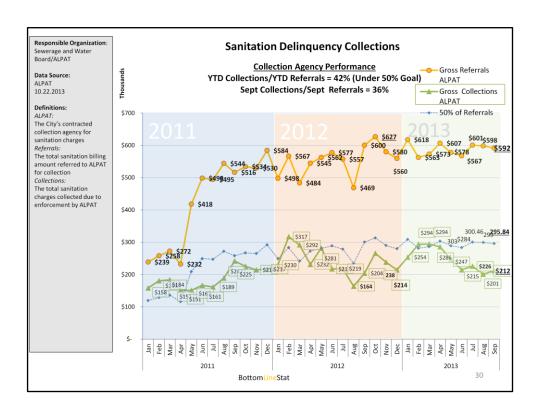


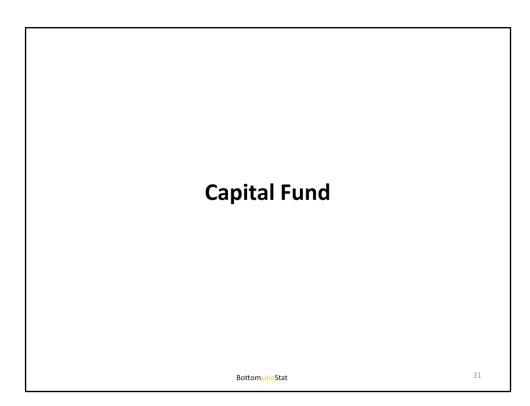


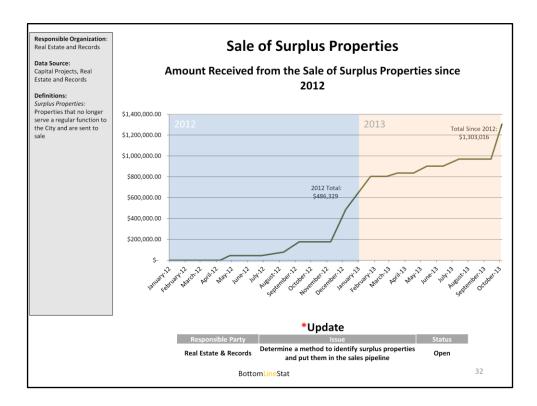
Because of the schedule used for property tax collection, there are still five months of revenue to be accounted for.



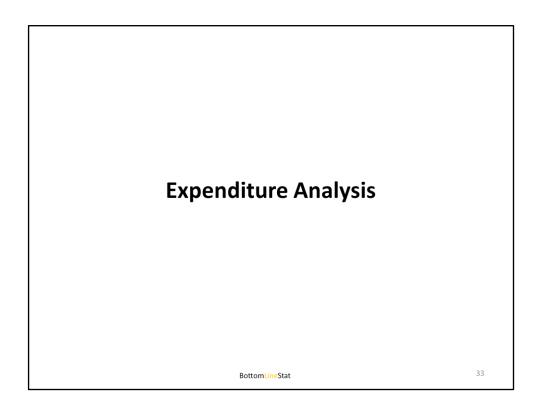








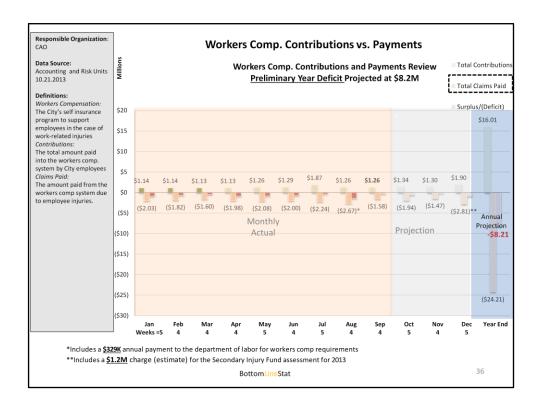
