

2016 Criminal Justice System Performance Measures

Performance Highlights

- **NOPD low priority response time improved by 18% in Q2 from Q1 (an improvement over 2015)**
- **Public perception of safety was down by 1% from 2015 although overall satisfaction with the New Orleans Police Department has gone up by 16 points since 2015**
- **Average length of stay for pre-trial detainees increased by 5% in Q2 from Q1**
- **The percent of felony charges accepted by the District Attorney increased by 1% in Q2 from Q1**
