ELECTION SIGNAGE

The Department of Parks and Parkways reminds all candidates of election signage rules and regulations from the City Code — please plan your sign campaign accordingly:

- Political signs may be placed on the public right-of-way 48 hours prior to an election. (Sec. 134-122)
- Political signs <u>must be removed 48 hours after the closing of the polls</u> for an election. (Sec. 134-122)
- No sign shall resemble any official marker erected by the city, state or any governmental agency which
 would conflict with the functioning of any traffic sign, signal, or switch, or which would conflict with or
 be confused with emergency vehicle lights, especially blinking lights. (Sec. 134-123)
- Use of words such as "stop," "look," "danger," or any other word, phrase, symbol, or character that could confuse traffic is prohibited. (Sec. 134-123)
- Signs may not be located or illuminated in such a manner as to obscure or otherwise interfere with the
 effectiveness of an official traffic sign, signal, or device, or obstruct or interfere with the view of a driver
 of approaching, merging, or intersecting traffic. (Sec. 134-126)
- No one may post or paint advertisements of any kind on any street, sidewalk, public buildings, utility
 poles, light standards, street signs, parking meters, or trees located in public right-of-way, or traffic signal
 standards. (Sec. 134-128)
