#### PROJECTS SUBJECT TO THE DESIGN ADVISORY COMMITTEE (DAC) REVIEW

The purpose of the Design Advisory Committee (DAC) is to promote design integrity in municipal facilities, to aid in the creating of an urban built environment which enhances the aesthetic and cultural qualities of the entire City and, in so doing promotes the health, safety, convenience and general welfare of the citizenry of New Orleans, Louisiana.

Matters within the purview of the committee shall include the following:

- 1. Public buildings: New or existing building which have exterior renovations or additions which involve color, materials, facades, lighting, signs or architectural features which have a visual impact upon the City;
- 2. Private improvements: Buildings funded in whole or in part by the City or an agency thereof; buildings constructed on land acquired or leased with funds provided in whole or in part by the City or an agency thereof, specifically including those acquired for development or redevelopment purposes;
- 3. Facades, awnings, landscaping, and light fixtures when they encroach into public property;
- 4. Art work, statues, monuments, or memorial structures proposed for acquisition by the City and to be installed on exterior property owned by the City or an agency thereof;
- 5. Public streets: New or altered alignments or widening rights-of-way if funded in whole or in part by the City;
- 6. Construction of bridges, overpasses, and underpasses funded in whole or in part the City;
- 7. Public thoroughfares, roadways, walkways, parks and open space (new and existing): general landscape design including changes in materials and colors;
- 8. Publicly located light fixtures, street name signs, traffic control signs, traffic control signs, trailblazer signs, benches and other street appurtenances for review and advice as to standards rather than specific installations;
- 9. Review of the comprehensive plan of the City or significant revisions thereof; and
- 10. Other requests of the Commission.
