The subsurface paving lights at the French Opera House sculpture are also experiencing outages each time the lagoon floods. The National Park complex, Fire House, North Rampart entrance, Congo Square and Municipal Auditorium areas are in need of floodlight, bulb, lamp, ballast and timer replacements. Additionally, a thirty foot long sidewalk needs to be repoured and a drain installed in the area near the Archway.</p>

Detailed Summary: Include Scope of work, parking requirements, landscaping, etc.	Scope of work is to construct a chemical storage and washdown building to support operations at Joseph Bartholomew Golf Course. The US EPA NPDES Stormwater Regulations mandate proper storage of herbicide, insecticide and fertilizer chemicals. If the golf course is found to be out of compliance with the mandate, the EPA and State have the authority to shut down operations at the golf course and/or levy fines.
