 <u>Consideration</u>: DESIGN REVIEW 132-16 – New construction and addition to existing cold storage facility with more than 40,000 square feet of floor area (TA) Location: 3401 Alvar Street Submitted by: Rodney Ratliff Contact: rodney@ratliffarchitects.com

Applicant stated stormwater plan was under review by CPC. There was little discussion regarding design issues.

CPC – Required landscape areas are deficient, a new landscape plan is needed.

PPW – the parkway needs to be restored in the right-of-way of both N. Broad and Bienville Streets, with grass and preferably some trees.

HDLC and PBP – remove pilasters and fake columns. Make more of an angle on the awnings. Need to know the materials of the awnings.

A motion for **DEFERRAL** of the project was made by PPW, seconded by HDLC, requesting revised plans be submitted with the suggested revisions, as discussed, and adopted.

 <u>Consideration</u>: DESIGN REVIEW 137-16 – Renovation of existing structure into a medical clinic in the enhancement corridor design overlay district with over 100' of frontage (NK) Location: 2077 Caton Street Submitted by: Randall Dover Contact: rd@rdover.net

CPC – submittals are consistent with the CZO.

PPW – would like to see more street trees on Senate Street side. Landscaping is required between the building and the sidewalk.

Motion:

A motion for **APPROVAL** of the project was made by PPW, seconded by PBP and adopted, subject to the applicant supplying updated landscape plan, as discussed.

 <u>Consideration</u>: DESIGN REVIEW 140-16 – Renovation of existing structure into an artist studio and gallery in the character preservation corridor (SL) Location: 4132 Magazine Street Submitted by: Albert Architecture Contact: dakerley@albert-architecture.com

HDLC – the proposed second floor addition will be visible from Milan Street, more attention should be made to how this will look. Also, recessed entries should be reconsidered as they provided a security issue.

PBP – questioned the number of materials and types of materials on exterior walls. Prefers two or three different materials rather than the four being presented – stucco, two horizontal wood or wood-looking materials, and windows.

Motion:

A motion for **DEFERRAL** of the project was made by PBP, seconded by PPW and adopted, subject to the applicant reconsidering the recessed front landing issue, as discussed, and supplying material and color samples for DAC review and approval.

 <u>Consideration</u>: Black Butterfly Sculpture Location: Poydras Street at O'Keefe Submitted by: Hailey Bowen (PPW) Contact: hdbowen@nola.gov

Jessie Haynes presented on behalf of Helis Oil. Sculpture by artist John Scott is proposed to go in median of Poydras near intersection of O'Keefe. DAC members praised the work and the proposal. There was discussion about the exact spot on the median being proposed. City and Helis are trying to avoid conflicts with junction box and other utility conflicts. There will be a concrete pad base and lighting.

Motion:

A motion for **APPROVAL** of the project was made by PBP, seconded by PPW and adopted.

 <u>Consideration</u>: Hunter's Field – Phase III – Field House Location: 1659 North Claiborne Avenue Submitted by: Michael Cajski, Jerry Harris (CPA) Contact: michael@volumezero.com; jeharris@nola.gov

Existing building and amphitheater to remain and be renovated, the new building is a one-story structure with 3,500 square feet of area.

PPW – suggested adding ribbon windows to maximize natural light sources.

AC suggested skylights as well.

The applicant stated that not all materials and colors had been selected and that they would return for the next DAC meeting with those selection samples.

Motion:

A motion for **DEFERRAL** of the project was made by PPW, seconded by PBP and adopted, subject to the applicant supplying material and color sample by the next DAC meeting, as discussed.

 <u>Consideration</u>: Youth Study Center – Addition Location: 1100 Milton Street Submitted by: Ian Dreyer (NANO Architects), Robert Vallejo (CPA) Contact: ian@nanollc.net; rvallejo.gov

This is an expansion of the Juvenile Justice Center, which was approved as a Conditional Use. It has yet to be determined if this phase is covered by the original Conditional Use approval or if it needs to go through that process again.

Applicant stated similar materials and color schemes from Phase 1 would be used again.

PPW – suggested changing the gray shade to a lighter shade. A suggestion was made to use the trees set for relocation in the recessed areas of the front façade.

HDLC and others – look at using ribbon widows is some areas to soften the look and provide more natural light. There was general discussion about the exterior walls and ways the design can soften and "humanize" (PBP) the facility without causing security concerns.

A motion for **DEFERRAL** of the project was made by HDLC seconded by PBP and adopted, subject to the applicant supplying design refinement plan, as discussed, including addressing of windows issue and a new landscape plan.

OTHER MATTERS:

There was general discussion regarding how to convey to applicants prior to the DAC meeting that, in some cases, material and color samples are essential for the DAC to approve a project and not force a deferral that could delay project. CPC will look at ways to do this within the confines of the CZO-dictated application process.
