# Request #1: Bulletproof Glass at District Stations

- This project is needed to ensure safety of desk officers at entrance of each district station
- The bulletproof glass would serve as a protective shield to safeguard officers from gunfire
- One year project, funding \$1,112,400
- Unfortunately, funding was reduced to address other projects therefore it remains as active project under capital projects



# Request #2: Crime Lab 4<sup>th</sup> Floor DNA Renovations

The Crime Lab is in dire need of renovations to 4<sup>th</sup> floor DNA Lab to meet specific operational needs and accreditation requirements for our goal of processing DNA in-house

Target goal for accreditation is 2027 provided facility meets the standards

Funding for project 2 years, design \$1M and construction \$8.6M, total project \$9,641,949



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## Request #3: New Central Evidence & Property Building

- Central Evidence & Property has been in a leased warehouse since Hurricane Katrina, unsuitable for current operations, plethora of maintenance issues (ac, heat, mold)
- City negotiating purchase of facility (Galvez Street) to house CE&P operations, building will require renovations and retrofitting. Year 1 funding \$1.7M acquisition, Year 2 funding \$14.5M renovations and Year 3 funding \$292k for security installation

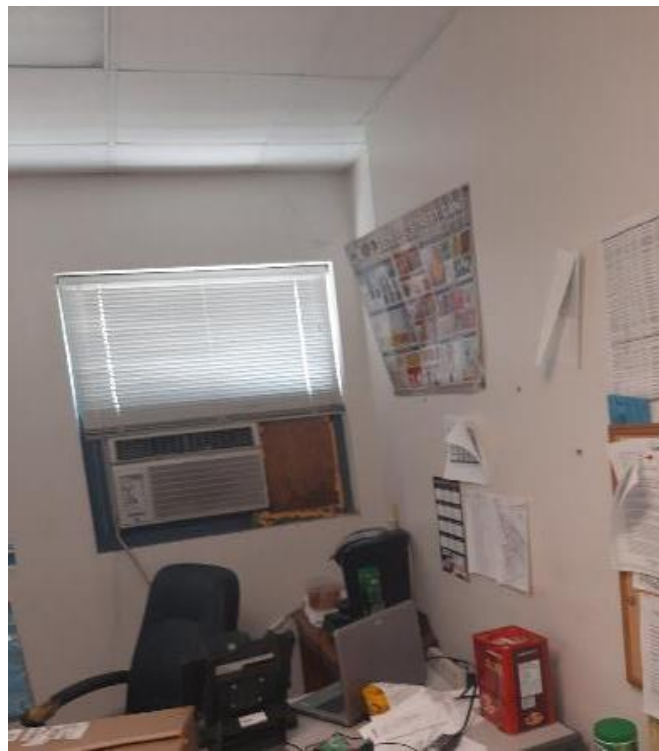
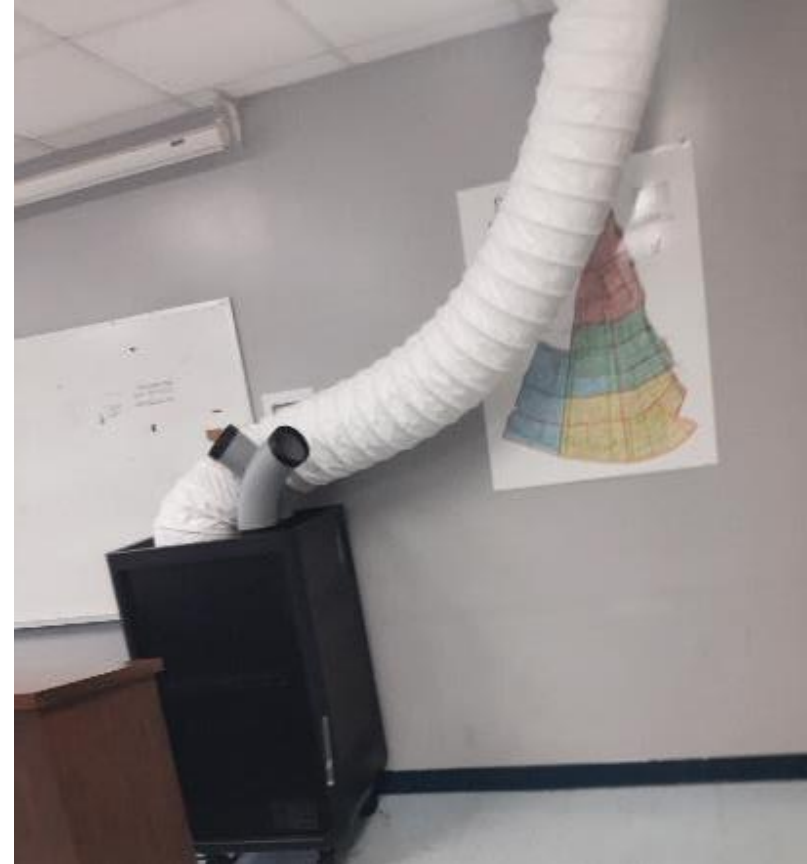
## New NOPD Headquarters & Garage

- NOPD recently moved to leased office space due to continuous maintenance issues experienced with aging HQ Building at 715 S Broad (Building completed 1968, 57 years ago)
- New temporary HQ Building 1615 Poydras (5-year lease), new building would facilitate the second phase of upgrading of the city's criminal justice complex (Municipal Traffic Court renovations are in final phase of completion)
- Year 1 funding \$5M for design phase, Year 2 funding \$52.9M for construction phase and Year 3 funding of security installation, \$4M for total of \$62.1M
- Unfortunately, funding was reduced to address other projects therefore it remains as active project under capital projects



## REQUEST #5: New 6th District Station

- The current 6<sup>th</sup> District station has experienced major challenges with a/c and other building maintenance repairs such as molded ceilings, non-functioning restrooms, etc.
- A new district station with approximately 13,100 sq ft would be suitable to house the current operations
- Funding for Year 1, \$493K for design phase, Year 2, \$5.6M for construction and Year 3, \$121k security for total of \$6,310,690





# REQUEST #6: New 1st District Station

- The current 1st District station is located at 501 N. Rampart Street, the major maintenance challenges are plumbing, non-functioning restrooms (urinals clogged), leaks in building causing flooding in the sally port, etc.
- A new district station with approximately 15,100 sq ft would be suitable to house the current operations
- Funding for Year 1, \$809K for design phase, Year 2, \$8.45M for construction and Year 3, \$169k security for total of \$9,274,754





# Request #7: 8<sup>th</sup> District Station Renovations

- This project was funded to make immediate improvements to the 8th District station to address the building condition and maintenance issues.
- The current 8<sup>th</sup> District is located on Royal Street in the French Quarter, the building was originally built in 1827 was damaged by fire and rebuilt in 1863
- Funding for major renovations, Year 1, design \$704k, Year 2 construction \$6.6M, Year 3 security \$260M, total project cost \$7,599,187
- Unfortunately, funding was reduced to address other projects therefore it remains as active project under capital projects

# Request #8: NOPD HQ Parking Garage Renovations

- Recently, the HQ parking garage has experienced structural failures which posed issues of safety
- Engineers were hired to provide remediation plan to address the structural compromise which resulted in this project being funded
- Unfortunately, funding was reduced to address other projects therefore it remains as active project under capital projects
- Project funding cost \$2,708,981
