

COMBINED NOTICE OF FINDING OF NO SIGNIFICANT IMPACT AND INTENT TO REQUEST RELEASE OF FUNDS

Publication Date: March 10, 2025 – March 25, 2025

This combined notice shall satisfy two separate but related procedural notification requirements. The two procedural notification requirements are (1) Finding of No Significant Impact and (2) Intent to Request Release of Funds. On or about March 26, 2025, the City of New Orleans Office of Community Development will submit a request to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development for the release of grant funds under the project known as “Canal Crossing Senior Housing”. The project consists of the Canal Crossing Senior Apartments, LP conducting the renovation and rehabilitation of the existing vacant, four-story building located at 2640 Canal Street, New Orleans, LA 70119. There will be (49) one-bedroom units. The Total Development Cost (TDC) of this rental activity is approximately \$19,769,145.00. The financial package consists of low-income and historic tax credits of \$12,690,454.00, and City of New Orleans’ participation of \$1,500,000.00 of General Obligation Bonds; \$500,000.00 Neighborhood Housing Improvement funds which will be a non-federal funding sources and federal Emergency Rental Assistance funds of \$4,000,000.00. The Housing Authority of New Orleans will provide approximately 49 project-based vouchers with an estimated amount of \$15,382,080.00 over 20 years.

FINDING OF NO SIGNIFICANT IMPACT

The City of New Orleans has determined that the project will not have a significant impact on the human environment. Therefore, an Environmental Impact Statement under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (NEPA) is not required. PUBLIC COMMENTS:

Any individual, group, or agency disagreeing with this determination, or wishing to comment on the program may submit written comments to this office. All comments received by March 25, 2025, will be considered by this office prior to the authorizing submission of a request for release of funds. RELEASE OF FUNDS:

The City of New Orleans certifies to HUD that Tyra Johnson Brown, Director of Housing Policy and Community Development in her capacity as Certifying Officer for Environmental Review for the City of New Orleans consents to accept the jurisdiction of

the Federal Courts if an action is brought to enforce responsibilities in relation to the environmental review process and that these responsibilities have been satisfied. HUD's approval of the certification satisfies its responsibilities under NEPA and related laws and authorities and allows the City of New Orleans to use Program Funds.

OBJECTIONS TO RELEASE OF FUNDS:

The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development will accept objections to its release of funds and the City of New Orleans' certification received by April, 14, 2025, or a period of fifteen days from its receipt of the request (whichever is later) only if they are on one of the following bases: (a) the certification was not executed by the Certifying Officer or other officer of the City of New Orleans; (b) the City of New Orleans has omitted a step or failed to make a decision or finding required by HUD regulations at 24 CFR Part 58; (c) the grant recipient or other participants in the project have committed funds or incurred costs not authorized by 24 CFR Part 58 before approval of a release of funds by the City of New Orleans; or (d) another Federal agency acting pursuant to 40 CFR Part 1504 has submitted a written finding that the project is unsatisfactory from the standpoint of environmental quality. Objections must be prepared and submitted in accordance with the required procedures (24 CFR Part 58) and shall be addressed to:
