# NOTICE OF FINDING OF NO SIGNIFICANT IMPACT AND INTENT TO REQUEST RELEASE OF FUNDS

These notices shall satisfy two separate but related procedural requirements for activities to be undertaken by The City of New Orleans.

## **REQUEST FOR RELEASE OF FUNDS**

On or about November 13, 2025, The City of New Orleans Office of Community Development will submit a request to the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) for the release of funds under the project known as Young Women's Christian Association of Greater New Orleans (YWCA). The project consists of construction and use of a two-story building on the footprint of the damaged Main Building, located at the west corner of Jefferson Davis Parkway (currently Norman C. Francis Parkway) and D'Hemecourt Street. The proposed facility will be 17,851 square feet; the additional square footage will be based on codes and standards. The facility will retain its previous functions in Day Care, Domestic Violence, Education and Training and services to the Elderly. In order to accommodate the new consolidated facility, the two existing damaged buildings need to be demolished. The design of the proposed facility is consistent with the function, capacity, size and purpose of the former damaged facilities. The project is located at 601 S. Norman C. Francis Parkway, New Orleans, Orleans, Louisiana 70119. The project will be funded through the Community Development Block Grant CARES Act (CDBG-CV) in the amount of \$250,000.00 under grant #B-21-MW-22-0006. The total project cost from all sources for this project is approximately \$10,379,318.00.

### **FINDING OF NO SIGNIFICANT IMPACT**

The City of New Orleans has determined that the project will not have a significant impact on the human environment. Therefore, an Environmental Impact Statement under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (NEPA) is not required. All comments received by November 12, 2025, will be considered by this office prior to authorizing submission of a request for release of funds. ### **ENVIRONMENTAL CERTIFICATION**

The City of New Orleans certifies to HUD that Tyra Johnson Brown, Executive Director of Housing Policy and Community Development in her capacity as Certifying Officer for Environmental Review for the City of New Orleans consents to accept the jurisdiction of the Federal Courts if an action is brought to enforce responsibilities in relation to the environmental review process and that these responsibilities have been satisfied. HUD's approval of the certification satisfies its responsibilities under NEPA and related laws and authorities and allows the City of New Orleans to use Program funds.

#### **OBJECTIONS TO RELEASE OF FUNDS**

HUD will accept objections to its release of funds and the City of New Orleans' certification received by November 28, 2025, or a period of fifteen days following the anticipated submission date or its actual receipt of the request (whichever is later) only if they are on one of the following bases: (a) the certification was not executed by the Certifying Officer or other officer of the City of New Orleans; (b) the City of New Orleans has omitted a step or failed to make a decision or finding required by HUD regulations at 24 CFR Part 58; (c) the grant recipient or other participants in the development process have committed funds, incurred costs or undertaken activities not authorized by 24 CFR Part 58 before approval of a release of funds by HUD; or (d) another Federal agency acting pursuant to 40 CFR Part 1504 has submitted a written finding that the project is unsatisfactory from the standpoint of environmental quality. Objections must be prepared and submitted in accordance with the required procedures (24 CFR Part 58, Sec. 58.76) and shall be addressed to:
