#### III. Consideration & Approval of the Minutes from December 17th, 2024

Commissioner Stevens asked for a motion to accept the adoption of the minutes. Kevin Hill moved to accept the minutes as distributed. The motion was seconded by Ron McClain and the motion passed unanimously.

#### IV. FY24 Victims of Crime Act Funding - \$861,426

Commissioner Stevens reiterated that the amount of VOCA funding available to allocate by the council for FY2024 is less than previous years. This decrease in funding has been expected and grantees have been made aware of this funding decrease for the last few years. She noted that the Grants Subcommittee met twice to review the notices of intent that were submitted and took their job of making a recommendation to the council very seriously. The Commissioner then invited Ms. Thelma French to give the Grants Subcommittee Update. Ms. Thelma French gave the following report:

Today we are voting to allocate Fiscal Year 2024 Victims of Crime Act (VOCA) Funding in the amount of \$861,426. The Notices of Intent were due to the Office of Criminal Justice Coordination on December 9th. The Notices of Intent were sent to councilmembers on December 30th, and the Grants Subcommittee met on January 13<sup>th</sup> at City Hall and then again virtually on January 22nd. The subcommittee had very difficult decisions to make with the requests exceeding the available funding by over \$1,135,000. The Subcommittee members gave each of the agencies present at the January 13<sup>th</sup> meeting time to present their project and time to answer questions before getting into the larger discussion of how to recommend that the funding should be allocated. Several decisions were made to get us to final number. None of those decisions were made lightly but overall the subcommittee recommended the following allocation.
