


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

Current facility use for City Hall Employees




Preliminary Site Plans: New City Hall






Armstrong Park as the Cultural Hub of NOLA

II. IMPACTS ON CITY HALL PROGRAM FROM COVID-19

COVID-19 Impacts & Program Changes

MAJOR GLOBAL SOCIETAL WORKING ENVIRONMENT IMPACT - COVID-19 shutdowns introduced Temporary Remote Work Policy for Large Number of City Employees Consistent with Offices Across Broad Segments of Society and Work-Forces Locally, Nationally and Globally.

Major Changes and Shifts to the Work Environment and Remote Work Policy Anticipated to be Here To Stay

ANALYSIS & IMPACT (PROCESS)

- 1. Determine Current Number of full-time Employees Projected to work primarily at City Hall in future;
- 2. The City conducted a survey to determine the number of current employees working in City Hall (sites) under the current work at home mandate (31%).
 - a) The reduction of staff working at City Hall provides the City with an opportunity to;
 - a) Eliminate the Woodward recommended annex building and stay within the Municipal Auditorium footprint (see slide 4).
 - b) Creates an opportunity to build in "touch down" space within the Auditorium for employees working remotely.
 - c) Allows the City to consider other City Agency partners to colocate in the Auditorium.

III. CURRENT PROJECTED COST / FUNDING SOURCES

Current Projected Cost / Funding Sources



Municipal Auditorium Buildout for City Hall - \$100 M - \$150 M

Master Plan for Armstrong Park

- Design Fees will be competitively procured
- Master Planning Design COST TBD (ADD \$480,000 –\$800,000)
- Master Plan implementation COST TBD (ADD \$12M \$25M)

Funding Sources

FEMA- \$38 M Bonds- \$22 M

Total: \$60 M

Additional funding sources being pursued/considered include FEMA Hazard Mitigation Funds (HMGP), Community Block Grant Development Funds (CDBG) and the disposition of additional City of New Orleans owned properties including the current City Hall.


Next Steps



Procure Design & Project Management Teams to Design New City Hall/ Develop Armstrong Park Master Plan

1. Issue Request for Proposals for Architectural and Project Management Services

- Begin the preliminary design for City Hall in Municipal Auditorium and the Ph. I (FEMA scope)
- Begin the Master Planning process for the site
- Continue Community Engagement
- Establish Community Advisory Committee
- Start the FEMA process for extending the Auditorium's Periodof-Performance (POP) to extend the deadline for the funding



2. Procurement of AE and PM to begin in Feb 2021- and take approx. 5 months
