




### State of Louisiana Covid-19 Metrics – Through 3/10/2023






### New Cases in New Orleans (7-day average) – Through 3/19/2023


#### New Orleans Vaccination Metrics – Percent of Vaccinated Population

#### New Orleans Vaccination Metrics –Vaccinated Population by Age






## **Components of Inflation**

- Price Level: average measurement of current price(s) paid for goods or services
- Inflation: increasing price levels observed over a period of time.
  - The term *inflation* describes the situation where price levels are currently increasing
  - Once price levels become stable, it is not technically *inflation*.
- However, following significant *inflation*, the price level remains elevated until *deflation* occurs.





### **Components of Gross Domestic Product**

- Gross Domestic Product: the monetary value of all finished goods and services made within a country.
- Real vs. Nominal GDP: Real is Inflation-adjusted; Nominal is Un-adjusted
  - Nominal GDP gives "inflated" picture of actual monetary value, Real GDP is adjusted down to eliminate effect of inflation over time.
- GDP = Personal Spending (Consumption) + Private Domestic Investment (Business Expenditures) + Government Consumption + Net Exports




### Net Contributions to Real GDP: Quarterly Change





### Year-Over-Year Growth in Payroll Employment by Month






#### **New Orleans Parish Labor Force and Unemployment Rate**








#### Louis Armstrong New Orleans International Airport Passenger Traffic 7-Day Moving Average
