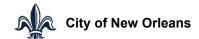

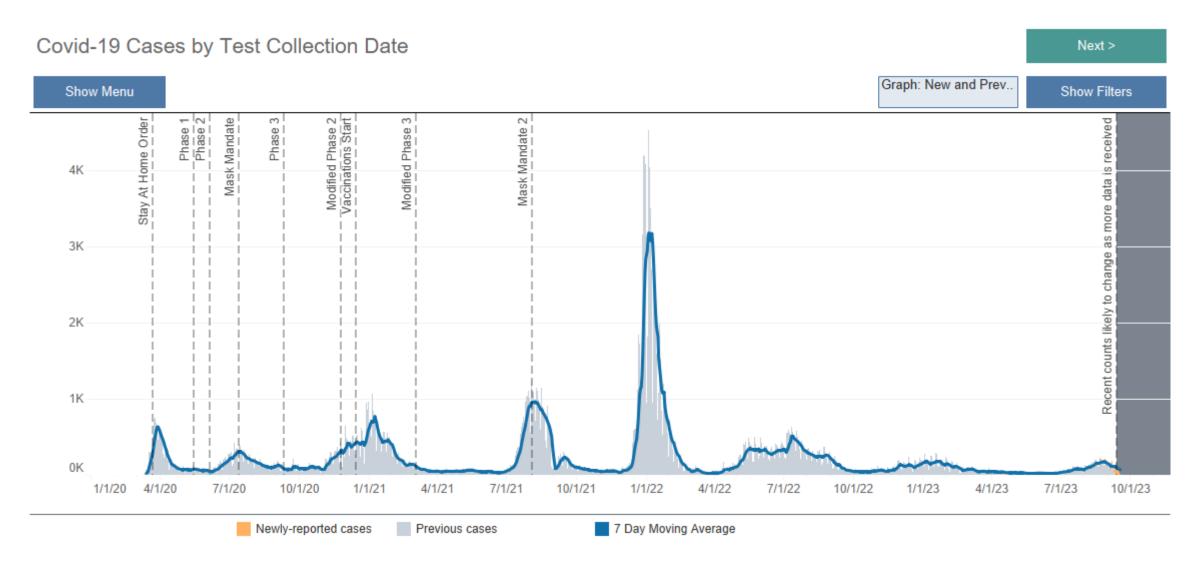

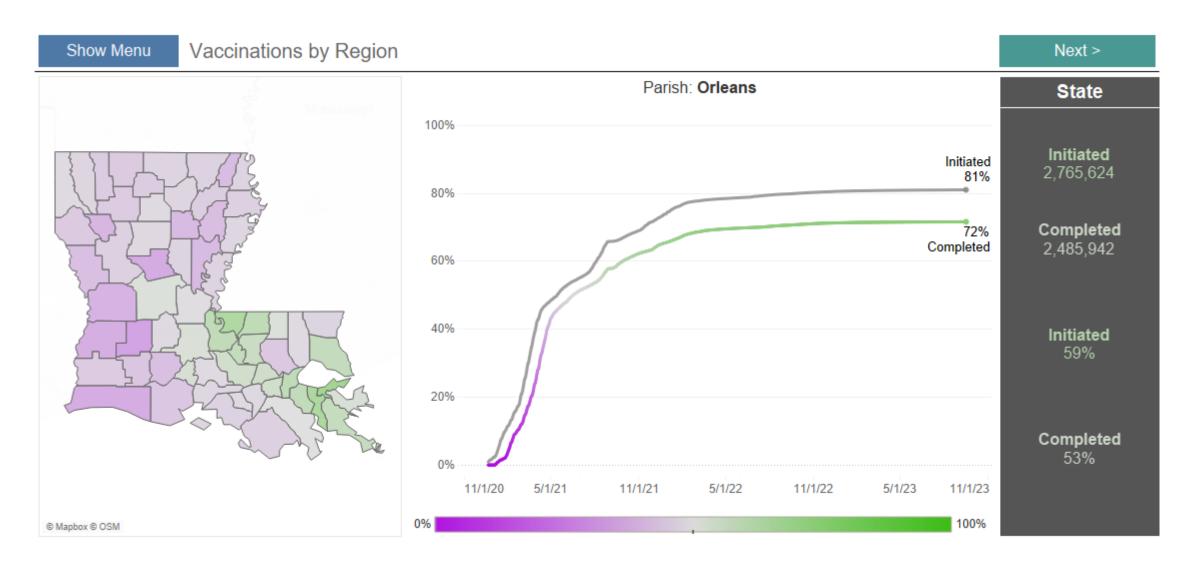


#### New Cases in New Orleans (7-day average) – Through 9/17/2023

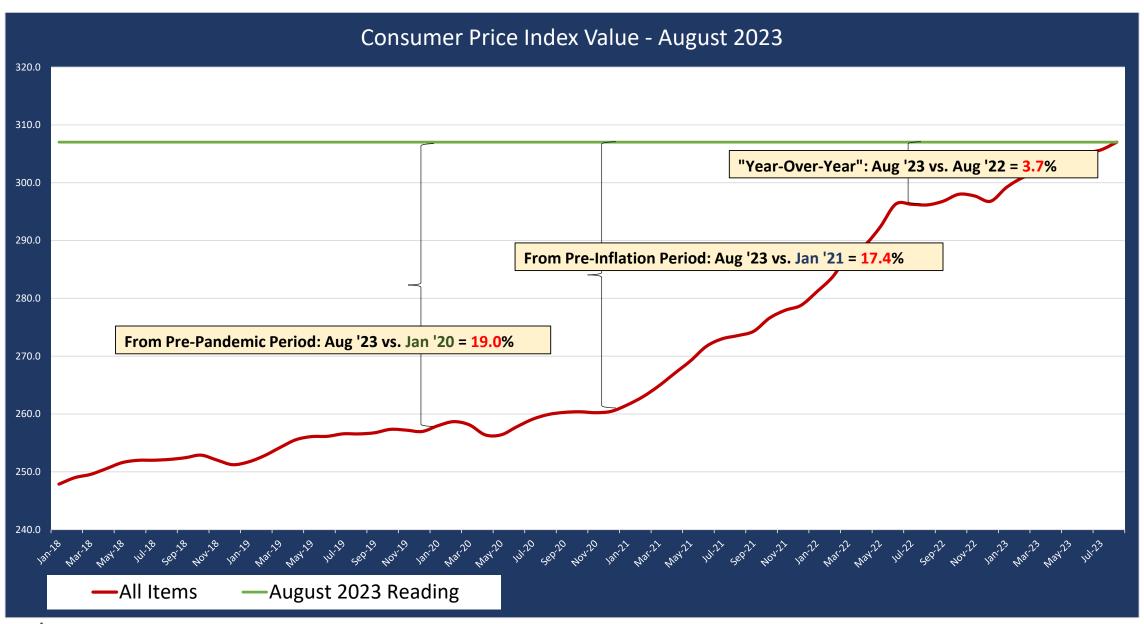


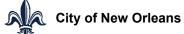


#### New Orleans Vaccination Metrics – Percent of Vaccinated Population: 9/17/2023





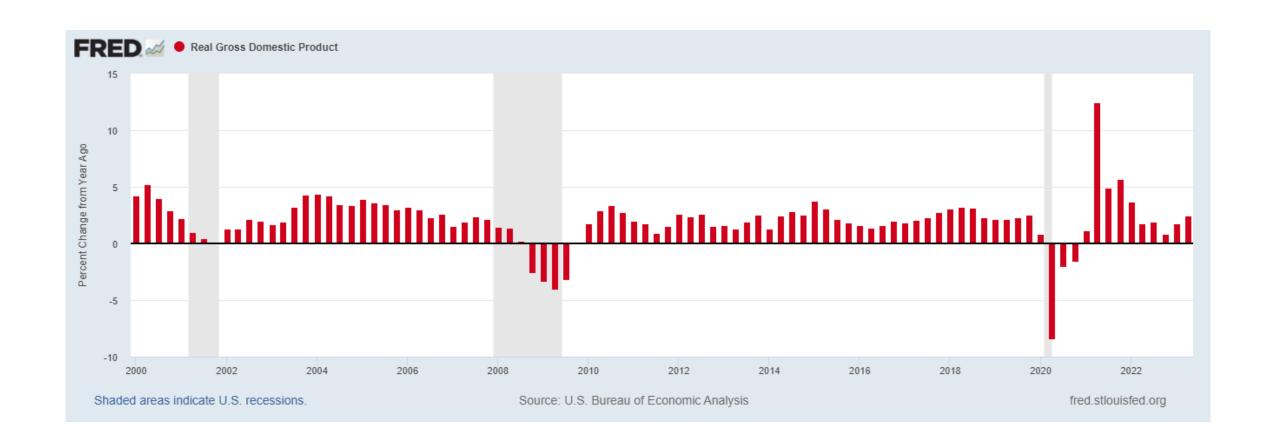




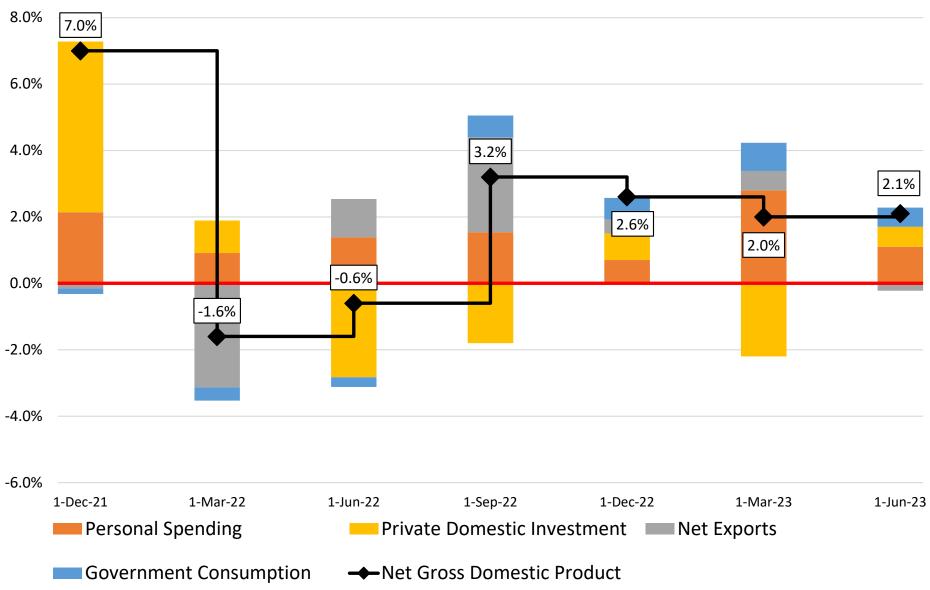
### **Additional Inflation Statistics**

- Basic household expenses are \$202 more than Fall 2022; \$709 more than Fall 2021 Moody's Economy
- Inflation-adjusted Median Household Income has fallen for three straight years (2020-2022), by 4.7% total *U.S. Census Bureau* 
  - Inflation has out-paced wage increases since pandemic
- Falling inflation-adjusted income, rising interest rates, and low supply of cars has priced half of Americans out of the market *Experian* 
  - New Vehicles Avg. payment in 2021: \$582; 2022: \$672; 2023: \$729
  - Used Vehicles Avg. payment in 2021: \$440; 2022: \$519; 2023: \$528



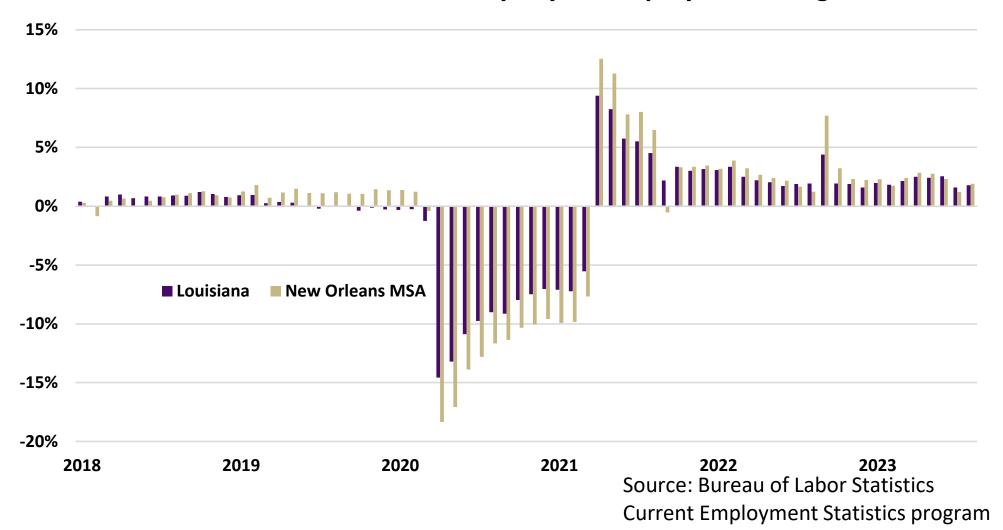


### **Net Contributions to Real GDP: Quarterly Change**



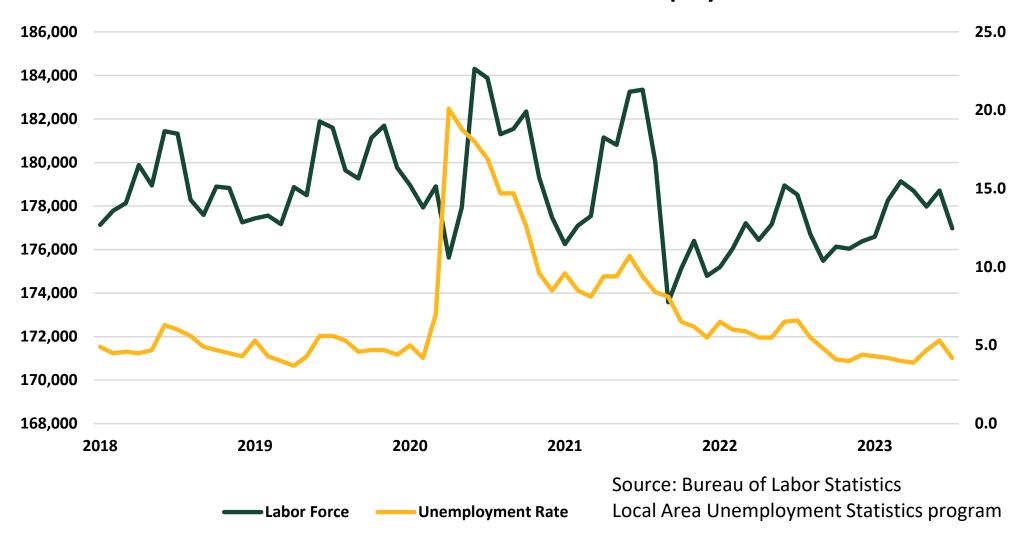


#### **Year-Over-Year Growth: Monthly Payroll Employment - Aug. 2023**



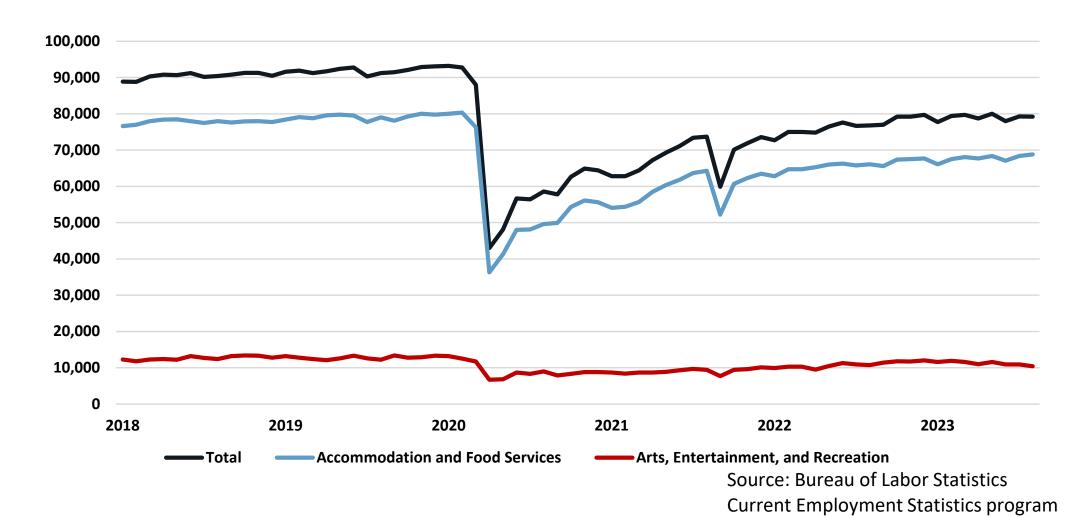


#### **New Orleans Parish Labor Force and Unemployment Rate**



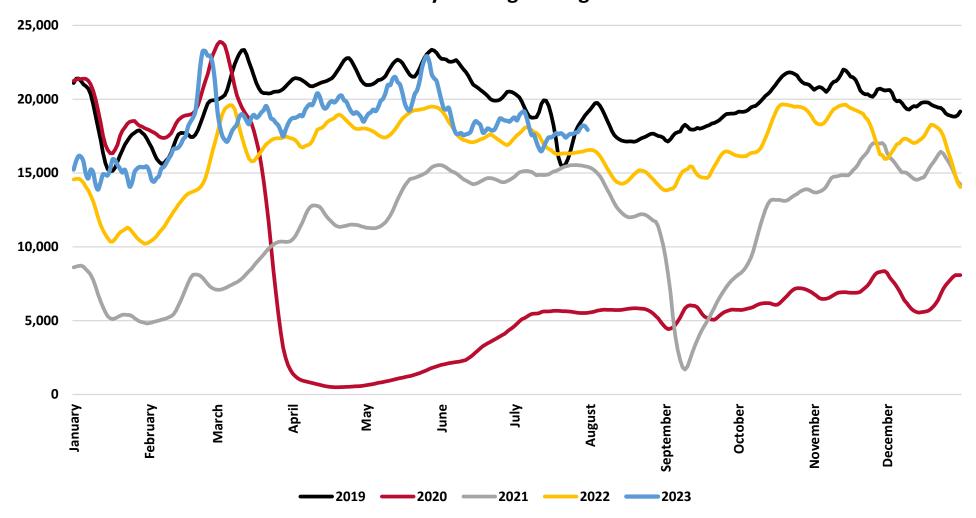


#### **New Orleans MSA - Leisure and Hospitality Sector**





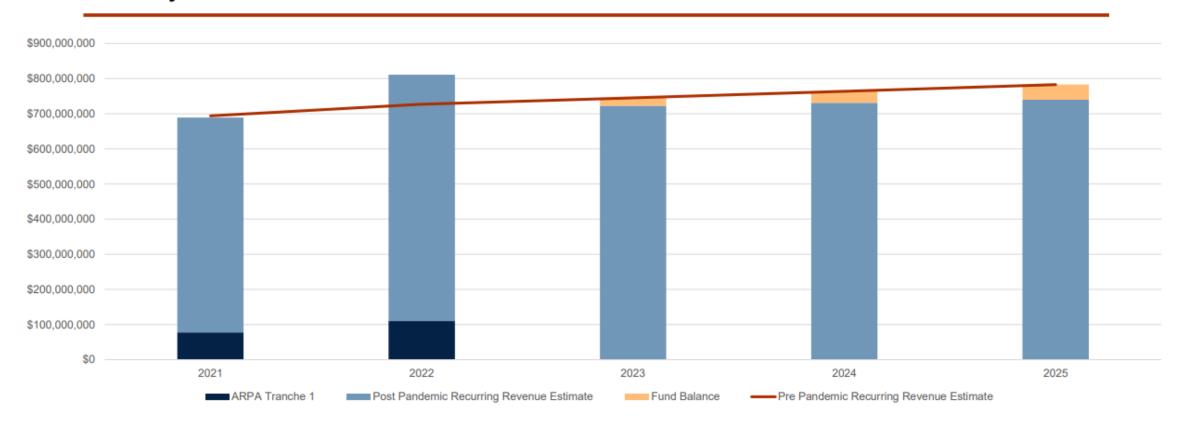
## Louis Armstrong New Orleans International Airport Passenger Traffic 7-Day Moving Average

## Factors Requiring 2023 Upgrade

- Known Revenue Events:
- Lagging revenues in Fines and Forfeits component: -\$6.9m
  - Operational processing issues with fines and penalty payments
- +\$28.1m One-Time Revenues in Miscellaneous component
  - +\$8.7m Interest received on cash held in bank
  - +\$0.5m Rents and Royalties payments
  - +\$9.1m Insurance and legal settlements in Contributions and Other
  - +\$10m payment from New Orleans Building Corporation in Miscellaneous Reimbursement

### **Key 2024 General Fund Forecast Notes**

 Nord Dedicated and Parkway Dedicated not counted as part of General Fund for 2024; equates to -\$13.7m

#### Fiscal Risks:

- Potential Elimination of Residential STR's = -\$21.8m for General Fund,
   Special/Dedicated Funds, and Disbursement to Non-City Agencies
- Permitting Process issues remain unresolved and backlog continues
  - Restrains initial permitting operations and revenues; matriculates through process
- Enacted City Ordinances
  - Elimination of Alcohol & Beverage Processing Fee = -\$1.5m
- Continued Recovery; potential remains for Economic Recession
  - Real Estate, Banking, and inflation crises; nationwide job and income disruption would directly impact NOLA commercial and visitor activity
