WHAT IS AFFORDABLE HOUSING?

Housing affordability is simply how much of a person's income goes towards housing costs each month, relative to family size.

- For renters, this includes rent and utility expenses
- For homeowners, this includes mortgage loan principle, interest, taxes, and insurance payment (PITI)

According to the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) a household spending more than 30 percent of their annual gross income on housing is **cost burdened.**

HOW MUCH CAN A TYPICAL NEW ORLEANS FAMILY AFFORD IN HOUSING COSTS?

Area Median Income (AMI) is the annual income earned by the median, or majority, of households in a region. Government agencies use these thresholds to determine which households qualify for housing assistance. Most housing, affordable or otherwise, is provided by the private market.


- There are very few subsidies available to provide affordable housing
- Government subsidies are generally granted to households at or below 80% AMI
- Median household income in Orleans Parish is \$38,423.

Experts believe we need approximately 33,593 additional affordable housing units to eliminate cost burden in New Orleans. Here are the types of housing opportunity we need the most:

- 2 and 3 br units for owners earning between 80% and 120% AMI and over 120% AMI
- 1 and 2 br units for renters earning under 30% AMI and over 100% AMI
