Out-of-School Youth

THE JOB1 YOUTHWORKS PROGRAM MAY BE A GOOD FIT IF:

- ▶ You're between 16 and 24 years old.
- ▶ You're not attending school.
- ▶ You're eligible to work in the United States.
- ▶ At least one of the following applies to you:
 - Foster child
 - Homeless/runaway
 - Pregnant or parenting
 - Offender
 - Disability
 - Never held gainful employment
 - English language learner
 - School dropout
 - Basic skills deficient



In-School Youth

THE JOB1 YOUTHWORKS PROGRAM MAY BE A GOOD FIT IF:

- ▶ You're between 14 and 21 years old.
- ▶ You're enrolled in school.
- ▶ You're eligible to work in the United States.
- ▶ You meet low-income eligibility standards.
- ▶ At least one of the following applies to you:
 - Foster child
 - Homeless/runaway
 - Pregnant or parenting
 - Offender
 - Disability
 - Behind one grade level or more
 - Never held gainful employment
 - English language learner
 - Basic skills deficient



To enroll in the program, you need:

- ▶ Valid Govt. issued Photo ID
- ▶ Birth Certificate & Social Security Card
- ▶ Household income information (if applicable)
- ▶ Proof of address
- ▶ Proof of school enrollment (if applicable)
- ▶ Youth 17 or under must be accompanied by a parent or legal guardian
