**TERMINATION OF MAYORAL PROCLAMATION OF MANDATORY CURFEW
DURING STATE OF EMERGENCY (IDA)**

WHEREAS, the Louisiana Homeland Security and Emergency Assistance and Disaster Act, La. R.S. 29:721, et seq., confers upon the Mayor of the City of New Orleans emergency powers to deal with emergencies and disasters in order to ensure that preparations of this City will be adequate to deal with such emergencies or disasters, and to preserve the natural resources of the City and lives and property of the people of the City of New Orleans; and

WHEREAS, La. R.S. 29:730.3(F) confers upon the Mayor of the City of New Orleans the authority to impose a curfew during a declared state of emergency; and


WHEREAS, in anticipation of the landfall of Tropical Storm/Hurricane Ida, I, LaToya Cantrell, Mayor of the City of New Orleans, issued the "Mayoral Proclamation of Emergency due to Tropical Storm Ida" (No. 2021-7266) on the 27th day of August; and

WHEREAS, on August 31, 2021, I, LaToya Cantrell, Mayor of the City of New Orleans, issued the "Mayoral Proclamation of Mandatory Curfew During State of Emergency" (No. 2021-07289) pursuant to La. R.S. 29:730.3(F), because a mandatory curfew was necessary to protect the public health, safety, and welfare of citizens, relief workers, and other persons and property within the borders of the City of New Orleans during this state of emergency; and

WHEREAS, said curfew is no longer necessary;

NOW THEREFORE, I, LATOYA CANTRELL, Mayor of the City of New Orleans, by virtue of the authority vested in me as the Mayor of the City of New Orleans by the Constitution and laws of the State of Louisiana and the Home Rule Charter and laws of the City of New Orleans, **HEREBY TERMINATE THE MANDATORY CURFEW IMPOSED VIA THE MAYORAL PROCLAMATION FILED ON AUGUST 31, 2021.**
